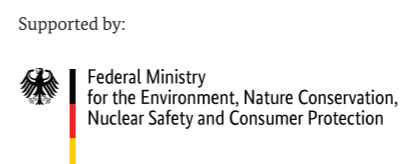
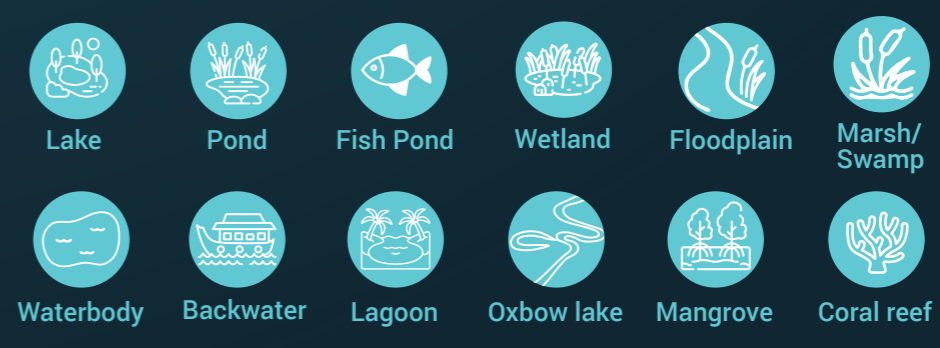
The different terms for wetlands in India

With its rich geographical diversity, India is home to various types of wetlands. While formal Hindi translation brings us the term आर्द्रभूमि (aardrabhoomi : water-land), one of the oldest words for wetlands used in India could be the Sanskrit word अनूप (Anoop : unique, also refers to marsh/lagoon/near water/ wetland). But these words cannot encompass the linguistic diversity or the different wetland types found in the country. Languages reflect the way communities interact with nature, and thus the regional interpretations of 'wetland' also reflect the local conditions, understanding and the relationship of people to the wetlands around them. This word map attempts to showcase some of these regional terms that reflect the interlinked natural and cultural heritage of country.
